<p><b>September 18, 2021</b> <b>11:45am-1:15pm</b></p>	<p><b><i>Dreams in Theory and Practice– Douglas Van Der Heide, MD</i></b></p> <p>Since Freud's opus of 1900 the dream and the process of dreaming remain the royal road to the heart of our work. To know how to work with dreams is tantamount to knowing how to do psychoanalysis. In this lecture I will review the core discoveries of mind, starting with Freud, which explain the why and wherefore of dreaming with the goal of underscoring how to work with them in the office to enrich and deepen the therapeutic exchange.</p>

Two analytic theories of mind can be applied to grasp this intellectually, prior to integrating emotionally this sensibility.</p>
